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Curriculum Area	Focus this half term	Opportunities for home learning
English	The Matchbox Diary by Paul Fleischman. The children discover a set of matchboxes containing some of the mementoes from the story and go on to make predictions and inferences, exploring vocabulary and writing in role. They use freeze-frames to help write a conversation between two migrants on board the ship to America and research two famous landmarks - Ellis Island and the Statue of Liberty. They finish by choosing some items for their own Matchbox Diary.	The expectation at St. Michael's is for every child to read out loud to someone at home at least three times a week. Please ensure that you sign the reading diary.
	One Upon A Dream — a poetry competition looking at descriptive techniques to write and publish a poem on the theme of 'Dreams'. These will be entered into a national competition and some will be chosen to be included in a poetry anthology.	
	The Story of Tutankhamun by Patricia Cleveland-Peck. The children begin by exploring the history of Tutankhamun and writing reports about Ancient Egypt before going on to find out about Howard Carter and exploring the stories and legends about the curse of Tutankhamun's tomb. The sequence of learning finishes with children writing a biography of Howard Carter.

Geography	Rivers: where water comes from; rivers of the world; features of a river; erosion and deposition; how we use rivers; dams and hydroelectric power
History	Roman Empire — Romans in Italy
PSHE	Money (including a session with a guest from HSBC on Monday 10 th June): how to pay for things; spending and saving; keeping track of money; risks associated with money including gambling; spending decisions and the impact on the environment (e.g. Fair Trade etc); the impact of money on feelings and emotions
Computing	Programming: repetition in programming using Scratch; designing and creating a game
P.E	Gymnastics: working with a partner; sequences; changing level and shape Outdoor and adventurous activities: problem-solving and adventure games; using map skills to navigate accurately around a course
